Parent Forum- Assessment In Literacy and Numeracy

We look forward to our Parent Forums each term, as it allows our parents an insight into our classrooms and school. This forum, was dedicated to 'assessment' and the different ways teachers assess students each and every day. There are 3 main forms of assessment that we strive to incorporate into our teaching units/programs. These are: Assessment for Learning, Assessment as learning & Assessment of Learning.

Principles of effective assessment

NESA advice on assessment



Assessment for learning

- enables teachers to use information about students' knowledge, understanding and skills to inform their teaching
- teachers provide feedback to students about their learning and how to improve

Assessment as learning

- involves students in the learning process where they monitor their own progress, ask questions and practise skills
- students use self-assessment and teacher feedback to reflect on their learning, consolidate their understanding and work towards learning goals

Assessment of learning

- assists teachers to use evidence of student learning to assess student achievement against learning goals, outcomes and standards
- · usually occurs at key points

After discussing these assessment forms, we enjoyed a mathematical task that showcased the assessable moments in every lesson. We had lots of fun, playing, exploring and learning maths (as well as the tricky maths words). We look forward to our next forum in Term 2.





Classroom Spotlight - 3/4 Holland

It has been a wonderful start to the year in 3/4 Holland! In eight short weeks, the class has begun to bond as a team, supporting each other in their learning.

In Numeracy, students have explored Whole Number, Length and are beginning to work on Addition and Subtraction. Students are developing their mental computation of mathematical strategies during Number Talks, considering a range of strategies they could use to solve a given problem. They are working hard to explain their thinking to others. As the term goes on, it's been fantastic to see children challenging themselves to try some new strategies and experience success.

In Literacy, students have been engaged in many collaborative and independent tasks, focusing on various key concepts including how to read fluently, identify the purpose and audience of a text and answer literal and inferential questions. It has been wonderful to see students transfer these skills into their work in Literacy Groups, where they are working towards personalised learning goals. In writing, we have already written many texts, focusing on character development and narrative structure. Students are working hard to develop ideas, draft and edit their work.

I have loved seeing students begin to set their own goals, take on teacher and peer feedback, and review their work. This links well to our class theme, DARE. We are DARING to Dream, Achieve, Reach and Succeed in everything we do both within and beyond the classroom.

Pulse Alive is a large-scale event, that provides high-quality opportunities in the performing arts for students and teachers in Greater Sydney NSW public schools and beyond. Pulse Alive provides performance opportunities for students of all abilities from Kindergarten to Year 12.
