Teddy Bear's Picnic

Year 6 buddies did an outstanding job at supporting this event - their leadership and care blew us away!

K- Vanuatu

K-Vanuatu have settled in so beautifully to school. What an amazing term of learning we have had too!

In Mathematics, students have been learning about the concept of patterns and have had opportunities to create their own AB, ABB and ABC patterns. Students from K-Vanuatu have also begun assessing their own learning with the traffic light system. The traffic light system is a tool to indicate to the teacher how confident they are when completing a set task. A green light indicates high levels of confidence, an orange light indicates some practice, whereas the red light is a sign that children need more practice. They will be continuing using this assessment tool throughout their learning.

In English, students have participated in a range of activities, including, guided reading and writing. In our Phonics program, students have learnt the phonemes (sounds) and graphemes (letter) m, t, a, s, i, p, f, r, o, c, k, ck. They have participated in a range of roaming activities to practise recognising, saying and writing these letters. Students have also learnt a range of high frequency and irregular words which will support their reading and writing. In class, we have had a focus on adding detail to our drawings and students have been working extremely hard to reflect on their drawings and improve them.

Well done for all your hard work so far K- Vanuatu. You have all settled into kindergarten so well and Miss Vas is extremely proud of you all! Keep up the wonderful work.

Library News with Mrs Washington


Overdue Notices
